Lawns and woody plants are monitored for active pests during site visits. When necessary, lab samples can be submitted to MSU extension for insect/disease identification or spectrum analytic for soil/foliar testing.	TruGreen understand the role the weather plays in landscaping management and maintenance. They complete property evaluations to ensure that are providing services and adjusting products to resolve any pending issues that might arise during different parts of the year. They also have several PH.D agronomists and horticulturists on staff to ensure they can address any issue they come across and their technicians receive continual training for industry best practices. If a field diagnosis of a problem is not possible it may be recommended to submit a plant tissue or soil sample to a lab for analysis.	All applications will have a complete summary of services completed that document the amount of product applied, time/date/applicator, and weather conditions at the time of applications. These records will be supplied to the city after each application or upon request.
	Company's philosophy related to these svcs.	Has always used an Integrated Pest Management approach to provide targeted treatments to control insect/disease pests. Degree-day models and phenological indicators let them know when various insect pests are active and most vulnerable to control treatments. In some instances changing cultural practices (i.e. watering) may solve a problem, while in other cases planting, a different type of plant may be the best solution.	TruGreen LP encourages preventative maintenance for tree/shrubs/turf and nuisance pest management. Has won several environmental stewardship awards, they comply with all state and federal regulations and label recommendations. Providing preventative care will often result in better looking grounds and reduced need for frequent curative applications that can many times be more costly.
