## State Budget

## **Executive Budget Recommendation: Historic \$74 Billion**

- Rebuilding Our Infrastructure
- Growing the Economy and Investing in Workers
- Improving Public Health
- Investing in Safe Communities
- Enhancing Education

#### **Timeline**

- House and Senate to exchange budget proposals in April
- Consensus Revenue Estimating Conference in May
- Goal of completion by early July



# Infrastructure and Quality of Life Supplementals

### **Public Act 53 (SB 565): \$4.7 Billion**

- \$1.3 Billion for storm water and wastewater improvement projects, as well as drinking water infrastructure advancement projects
- \$200 million in local parks and trail infrastructure grants
- \$121.4 million for a homeowner assistance fund to help families experiencing financial hardship after Jan. 21, 2020
- \$250.6 million to offer competitive broadband infrastructure grants to boost connectivity in unserved areas

## Public Act 61 (House Bill 5525): \$140 Million

- · Money to be used for fighting unemployment fraud
- Stabilization of Unemployment Trust Fund
