SUBJECT: 2021 Butler Road Rehabilitation Program

City File No. E21-002

REQUEST:

City Council is requested to authorize a blanket purchase order/contract for the 2021 Butler Road Rehabilitation Project to the City of Auburn Hills in a not not-to-exceed amount of \$45,000.00 and further authorizes the Mayor to execute a contract on behalf of the City.

REASON FOR PURCHASE:

A traffic control maintenance and safety concern was raised by the Butler Road contractor, Pro-Line Asphalt (PLA), to the Department of Public Services. PLA requested that Rochester Hills establish a project detour that would allow the use of Butler Road in the City of Auburn Hills. City staff agreed with this change in how the maintenance of traffic should be handled and coordinated with the Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC) and Auburn Hills (AH) to secure their approvals for detour signage and use along Adams (RCOC), Squirrel (AH) and Butler (AH).

The Auburn Hills approval was issued with a right-of-way use permit and a condition of the permit. Auburn Hills was concerned that the use of their section of Butler Road would be damaged by the construction and detour traffic and required that Butler be restored. The Rochester Hills engineering staff agreed that this was a reasonable concern.

The two communities requested that PLA provide a cost estimate for performing the road restoration with the intention of paying for the work through a change order in the Rochester Hills Butler Road project. PLA would not agree to use the same unit prices for work in Auburn Hills that was included in the Rochester Hills project. It became evident that the expense was too high and unreasonable.

In a good display of neighborly cooperation, Auburn Hills then suggested an alternative to utilize two contractors that they had retained for other work in their community to complete the road restoration work. The Rochester Hills engineering staff agreed that this proposal was a better overall option but it would require another purchase order approval by City Council since project payment is only permitted to PLA.

Auburn Hills has suggested a 40% RH and 60% AH share of the actual costs for the proposed Butler road restoration work. The Rochester Hills allocation is estimated at \$32,000 to \$40,000. The budget section of this agenda summary was prepared to request a not-to-exceed approval of \$45,000 from the previously approved project contingency.
