

- Leverage CRT benefits Quality of Life, Healthy Communities, Town & County Legacy, Economic Development – in a WORLD CLASS way



 - Why?






Mile Marker

Proposed Trail Amenity Designs








Proposed Trail Gateway

Proposed Road Crossing Signs




Initial Round of Prototyping on the Trail






FCRT Purchasing Two Full-Scale Prototypes Will Install at Crooks Rd. Crossing

 - Engineering & Fabrication Details
 - Purchase of Two Full-Scale Prototypes
 - Identification of Potential Grant Source

- FCRT has Invested \$33K for Design, Consensus Building, Engineering & Prototyping
- FCRT Believes the Look & Feel Project Reflects Community Desires, Has Support of Local Stakeholders & Takes a Leadership Role in State-wide Trails
- FCRT Encourages Council to Support a Resolution for City Staff to Pursue Grant Funding to Implement Trail Amenities
