1 1/2 story gable roof house of irregular plan. Original portion side-gabled. Wing addition on east with dormer windows. One story shed roof bay with door added to gable front. Small shed roof wing with entrance porch on west side. Frieze windows on west side. Enclosed rear porch addition.

Cupola. Two brick chimneys.

Other Buildings/Features:

Split rail fence surrounds property. Circular drive in front of house with fenced, grassy area in center. Playhouse inside fenced area. Chicken house and storage shed on east side of drive. Duck house on west side of drive. Slate walk in front and on west side of house. Lily pond in back of

house. Dock in rear on pond.

Significant Persons:

Statement of Significance:

This house was part of the Winkler Mill property until 1975. The original house was a 1 1/2 story side gabled rectangular plan house and remained so until Frances Hosmer purchased the property in 1921. Mrs. Hosmer and her daughter Dorothy Brown expanded and remodeled the house in the Colonial Revival style in the 1920s and 1930s. However the Greek Revival characteristics such as the frieze windows remain visible. The current owners extended the east wing in a manner not to detract from the house's historic character.
