I'd like to submit a complaint regarding the proposed plan to remove trees and build a new home, as I understand is proposed, at 1691 W. Auburn Rd. I've lived at 3057 Wilmington Blvd. for approximately four years now and the woods in question are directly behind my house. They are one of the main reasons I purchased this home. It was my understanding that the property in question was considered a watershed – I believe part of the Rouge River watershed – and as such was protected wetlands. Rochester Hills likes to call itself "Tree City USA" yet all around me I see the removal of our trees.

My worries and concerns are as follows:

- Declining home value due to loss of nature this affects everyone who has a home backing up
 to this property you can't replace the beauty of trees and wildlife which make living here
 desirable
- 2. Loss of wetland as mentioned this being a watershed area
- 3. Loss of habitat for all the wildlife that live in this area

I would like to also include the following which is taken directly from the city of Rochester Hills Ordinance Number 612.

Sec. 126-263. - Purpose.

The purposes of this article are to:

(1)

Provide for the protection, preservation, proper maintenance and use of trees and woodlands located in this city in order to minimize disturbance to them and to prevent damage from erosion and siltation, a loss of wildlife and vegetation, and/or from the destruction of the natural habitat.

(2)

Protect the woodlands, including trees and other forms of vegetation, of this city for their economic support of local property values when allowed to remain uncleared and/or unharvested and for their natural beauty, wilderness character, and their geological, ecological, or historical significance.

(3)
Provide for the paramount public concern for these natural resources in the interest of health, safety and general welfare of the residents of this city.

I would prefer that this land stay as it is and not be altered. If it must be then I'd like assurance that no wetlands are lost or contaminated, tree removal is minimized and that a beautification plan is put in place to offset the negative effects that this loss of nature causes to neighboring properties.
