Roger: There is no such certification that I am aware of. The Transportation Asset Management Council has reviewed a number of software programs and found all of them to be acceptable. They include:

RoadSoft - Michigan Tech
MicroPaver - Corps of Engineers
Stantec
AgileAssets
Cartegraph
Hansen
Deighton

Each of these companies has software that can be used to run an asset management program. They also have web pages describing what they have available. Each offers different things and depending on what you want to do will really determine which is the best fit for your community. Also, SEMCOG is going to be testing a program called AssetManagerNT. You might want to talk with them.
