SUBJECT:	Preliminary Engineering Services for the Bloomer Park Parking Lot Reconstruction Project (City File No. E23-006)

REQUEST:

City Council is requested to approve an amendment and increase to the contract/blanket purchase order to Nowak and Fraus Engineers (NFE), Pontiac, Michigan for added scope of services for additional design work to address and include erosion control measures to existing drainage systems at Borden Park in the amount of \$45,832.00 and to add scope of services for design work to construct a new pathway from the new roundabout pathway at Avon Road and heading north to connect to existing trails within Bloomer Park in the amount of \$50,092.00 for a new total not-to-exceed contract amount of \$211,024.00 and further authorizes the Mayor to execute a contract amendment on behalf of the City.

REASON FOR PURCHASE:

The Department of Public Services is currently working with the Parks & Natural Resources and the Building Department Facilities Division to advance the Bloomer Park preliminary engineering (PE) design. Nowak and Fraus Engineers was previously retained by the City to complete design plans and specifications to bid a project to reconstruct the existing parking lots and paved paths within Bloomer Park.

Discussions during initial design meetings reviewed the significant erosion that is occurring within the park at existing drainage outlets and based on the discussions led the City to request a proposal from NFE for possible solutions to correct the erosion issues.

Additionally, with the new roundabout and adjacent pathway that was built by the Road Commission for Oakland County at the Avon and Dequindre intersection has presented a new opportunity to enhance access into Bloomer Park and increase connectivity from Avon Road. Informal movements into and from the park north of the roundabout has existed for many years. The option to construct a better option for walking or biking recreational users to Bloomer Park was suggested, and as a result, a proposal from NFE was requested to prepare design documents for a path that would connect the Avon Road pathway to existing trails within the park.

The proposals for the increased scope of services is attached.
