**SUBJECT:** 2012 Spring Street Tree Planting

#### **REQUEST:**

City Council is requested to authorize a blanket purchase order to Michigan Lawn Maintenance, Inc. dba Sherman Nursery Farms, Columbus, Michigan for the 2012 Spring Street Tree Planting in the amount not-to-exceed \$40,000.00.

#### **REASON FOR PURCHASE:**

Request for Proposals were solicited with Michigan Lawn Maintenance, Inc. dba Sherman Nursery Farms selected as offering the best value for the City, based on lowest cost, experience, quality and variety of product and ability to meet the City's specifications. The Forestry Division would like to exercise an option to renew the 2011 contract for the spring street tree planting. The City has utilized the services of Sherman Nursery Farms in the past and has received good product and excellent services.

The Forestry Division contracts for the planting of trees along City roads, in parks and at other facilities. Two separate planting programs are currently in effect: the "Subdivision Tree Planting Program" and the "Cooperative Tree Planting Program."

The Subdivision Tree Planting Program began in 1979, after adoption of the Subdivision Control Ordinance requiring developers of all new subdivisions to provide funds for one street tree to be planted by the City in front of each new home. Funds for this program are held by the City in an escrow account until the new homes are completed and occupied. The Forestry Division then includes that property in a forthcoming planting project.

The Cooperative Tree Planting Program was initiated in 1999, when policy was established authorizing the use of the City's "Tree Fund" (created by the Tree Conservation Ordinance in 1988, and distinct from the above escrow account) to match 50% of the cost of trees purchased by residents (or businesses) for planting along public streets and on public properties throughout the City. The Tree Fund revenues are generated from payments by developers and builders in lieu of planting replacements for regulated trees removed (or damaged) during construction.
