SUBJECT: Resolution Opposing the Elimination of the CDBG Program

REQUEST:

I request that the Rochester Hills City Council adopt the Resolution opposing the elimination of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Rochester Hills has been involved in the CDBG program through Oakland County since the programs inception in 1975. Over that time the City has allocated over \$3.8 million to provide needed services for our residents.

Oakland County officials are extremely concerned about President Bush's 2006 budget proposal to **eliminate** the CDGB program. This initiative consolidates the CDBG and 17 other economic development programs from five federal departments and **replaces** them with one new program, *Strengthening America's Communities Initiative*, under the Commerce Department.

The 18 programs, at FY 2005 funding levels of \$5.5 billion would reemerge as one new program whose funding level is proposed at \$3.7 billion, nearly \$1 billion less than the \$4.7 billion in total 2005 CDBG funding alone. If approved by Congress, the *Strengthening America's Communities Initiative* would focus primarily on economic development activities for distressed urban communities below the national poverty level. This results in a complete loss of CDBG funds to Oakland County and in turn to the City of Rochester Hills.

The Oakland County CDBG program of 50 communities will lose over \$4.36 million in formula grants to participating communities, of which the City of Rochester Hills is scheduled to receive \$176,567 for planning year 2005-2006.

The City of Rochester Hills historically has used its funding formula allocation to provide:

- Home Chore Program Services to approx. 100 low-income seniors including
 - o Bi-weekly Lawn Mowing Service
 - o Spring & Fall Yard Cleanup
 - o Snow Plowing Services
- Support to a variety of Service Agencies that provide services to low-income residents including:
 - o Rochester Area Youth Assistance (RAYA)
 - o Avondale Youth Assistance (AYA)
 - o HAVEN

- o Women's Survival Center
- o Rochester Area Neighborhood House
- Minor Home Repair services to assist low-income homeowners with necessary home repairs including:
 - o Furnace Replacement
 - o Roof Repairs
 - o Water / Sewer Installation
 - o Ordinance Violation Yard Cleanup Services
- ADA Improvements

RECOMMENDATION:

I recommend that the Rochester Hills City Council adopt the Resolution opposing the elimination of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program.
