

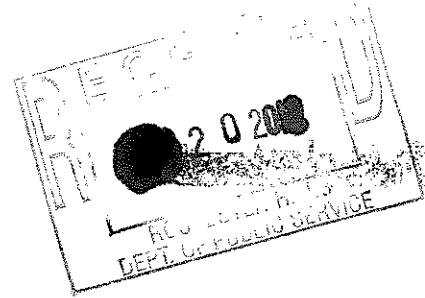

**Subject: Pathway Relocation**

Dear Mr. Matich,

As you know, the Board of Grosse Pines Homeowners Association has completed the final design of a major Landscape Renovation Project across the entire Walton frontage, approximately 1,200 feet. The Board is currently soliciting price information from four full landscape organizations. The final bid analysis and contractor selection will be completed by the end April. Additionally, the Board will develop the final implementation plan for this year.

In conjunction with our Landscape Project, the board is requesting the City of Rochester Hills to consider relocating the existing pathway to allow a larger buffer between the Walton curb and sidewalk, thus allowing Grosse Pines to plant addition trees along the Walton frontage and also provide greater safety for any pedestrian traffic. We believe this would be the most opportune window to consider the pathway project.

Please consider this communications your authority from the Grosse Pines Board to immediately move forward with the pathway relocation for the entire Walton frontage. We already have incorporated the potential pathway relocation into our new landscape design. The Board strongly believes pathway relocation to the Walton frontage will provide additional benefits to our Landscape Renovation Project and will definitely enhance the Grosse Pines entrances.

Additionally, please consider completing any pavement relocation work to this summer or fall the latest.
