Meeting Notes:

Council members discussed the recommended City Council Policy for Internet Access, noting the following:

* Discussion of this issue should be postponed for the new Council to discuss following the November election.

* Internet access, cell phone and pager usage have not been abused by Council members.

* Internet access during a Council meeting can be used for quick research to enhance the discussion.

* It is a matter of common sense and courtesy to silence your cell phone and pager during meetings.

* Council has no authority to enforce such a policy, as individual members are accountable only to their constituents.

* There already exists a policy issued by the MIS Department that encompasses these issues.

President Hill wanted it noted that these were not her policies, but were recommendations brought forward by the AIS Committee as directed by City Council.

The Consensus of Council was to postpone further discussion and consideration of this matter until after the November election when the new Council members could participate.

	of communication devices during Council meetings could be softened suggesting the use of the word "discouraged" in place of "prohibited."					

Mr. Duistermars noted that the issue was a matter of common sense and courtesy, suggesting that Council members place their pagers and cell phones on vibrate during meetings and exercise discretion when drawn away from meetings due to emergencies.

It was stressed by Council members that the resources available to them at the dais were an enhancement of their abilities.

President Rosen agreed while indicating that his primary concern with regard to this matter is that Council members not be distracted by these resources and that no use of communication devices during meetings runs afoul of the Open Meetings Act or the Freedom of Information Act.

City Attorney John Staran concurred and asked that he be permitted to provide input into this matter prior to the adoption of any new policy.

The Committee commenced discussion regarding the Draft Policy - Use of Electronic Communication Devices During City Council Meetings and made the following points:

* The Draft Policy stemmed from a past concern regarding access to the Internet, blogging, reading emails, etc. during a Council meeting with respect to how that may be in violation of the Open Meetings Act as well as how it may influence a Council member's vote if he/she obtained significant information that was not shared with other Council members during a public meeting.

* Once Council members enter a public meeting, they should no longer be in a discussion with someone. Their deliberations during a public meeting fall under the Open Meetings Act even when Council members take a recess during a public meeting. When a recess takes place during public meeting, each Council member is only allowed to have conversations with no more than two (2) other Council members in a group setting. They are encouraged to share any new information that may influence their vote. The Opens Meeting Act governs until the public meeting is adjourned.

* Any Council member can ask for a recess to research a particular topic in question. However, the key is for the Council member to share the information gathered during the break with the whole Council body when the public meeting is convened so that the information is "on the record".

* Use of various electronic means during an open meeting may be perceived as not sharing information.

* Council members should conduct themselves with proper etiquette and ethics to strive to avoid misperceptions that may result from usage of various electronic means during an open meeting.

* The Draft policy is not saying that a Council member should not answer emergency calls, but use discretion of how he/she answers pages, etc.

* It was suggested to change the word "refrain" to "discourage" where appropriate in the Draft Policy.

* It was suggested to check with the City of Troy regarding a recent policy that may have been passed regarding use of electronic devices during an open meeting.

The consensus of the Committee was that they agree with the way the Draft Policy was written. They will discuss it again at the AIS March meeting before bringing it to Council to explain how it should be interpreted.

Committee Notes:

The Committee commenced discussion regarding Draft 1 and suggested the following changes:

* Number 1 should reflect, "When official meetings/work sessions of Council are in session, the use of cell phones and pagers for active communications are strictly prohibited".

* Number 2b should reflect, "When official meetings of Council are in session, City Council members will refrain from using all of the above communication systems/devices in a manner that would violate the provisions of the Open Meetings Act, 276, PA 1967."

The consensus of the Committee was to direct the Clerk's Office to make the changes as discussed and prepare Draft 2 for a future City Council meeting. Other policy changes that the AIS Committee is currently reviewing will also be taken to a future Council meeting along with this recommended policy.
