SUBJECT: "2006" Pathway Rehabilitation Project

REQUEST:

The Department of Public Service recommends accepting the bid and awarding a contract for the 2006 Pathway Rehabilitation Project to Pro-Line Asphalt Paving of Washington, Michigan as the lowest responsive, responsible bidder in the amount of \$145,096.96 and authorize the Mayor and Clerk to execute a contract on behalf of the City.

REASON FOR PURCHASE:

On Thursday, May 4, 2006, the City received three (3) sealed bids for the 2006 Pathway Rehabilitation Project and Pro-Line Asphalt Paving was the lowest responsive, responsible bidder. The bid received from Pro-Line Asphalt is 10% over the Engineer's Estimate and 5% below the next lowest bidder, Peake Contracting, and 10% lower than the highest bidder, ABC Paving Company, which is shown on the attached bid tabulation. Work is expected to begin in June 2006 with a completion date scheduled for July 17, 2006.

The Scope of Work for this project includes the rehabilitation of approximately 1.5 miles of existing 8' wide HMA pathway at the following locations:

1. Auburn Road (North side) from Harrington to Walbridge;
2. Rochester Road (East side) from Auburn Road to Wabash & Rochester Road (E side) from Auburn Road to 740' North of Auburn Road;
3. Rochester Road (West side) from Nawakwa to 130' South of Auburn Road;
4. Auburn Road (South side) from 200' East of Rochester Road to 600' East of Primrose Drive and Auburn Road (North side) from Rochester Road to 50' East of Barclay Circle.
