- Review 2014 to present
 - Millage passed by a vote of 70%

ANSWERS TO YOUR QUESTIONS ABOUT THE ROCHESTER HILLS FIRE AND EMS MILLAGE

Q. Why is this important to Rochester Hills?

- A. Improve public safety and well being for all residents by;
- Providing faster response times in emergencies
 - Providing 24/7 Firefighters and Advanced Life Support personnel to all 5 fire stations

Q. How much will this cost my family?

- A. It will cost a house at \$100,000 of home value approximately **\$37** per year, or **11 cents** per day.

Q. What is the Millage Proposal on the November Ballot?

- A. A proposal to increase the millage of the Rochester Hills City Charter from 2.5 mills to 3 mills. However, the City Council will only levy up to 2.7 mills for Fiscal Year 2015.



- Review 2014 to Present
 - Hired nine (9) new firefighter/paramedics
 - Promoted fifteen (15) Lieutenants



- Review of 2014 to present
 - All five (5) stations staffed 24 hours a day, 365 days a year with Fire/ALS coverage.
 - Renovations completed on Stations 1,2,3 and 5



- Review 2014 to present
 - Purchased five (5) new ambulances to replace aging fleet to include patient lift system.
 - Purchased several new fire apparatus to replace aging fleet.



- Review 2014 to present
 - Purchased new Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus with Escape Harness
 - Purchased LUCAS Chest Compression (CPR) Devices

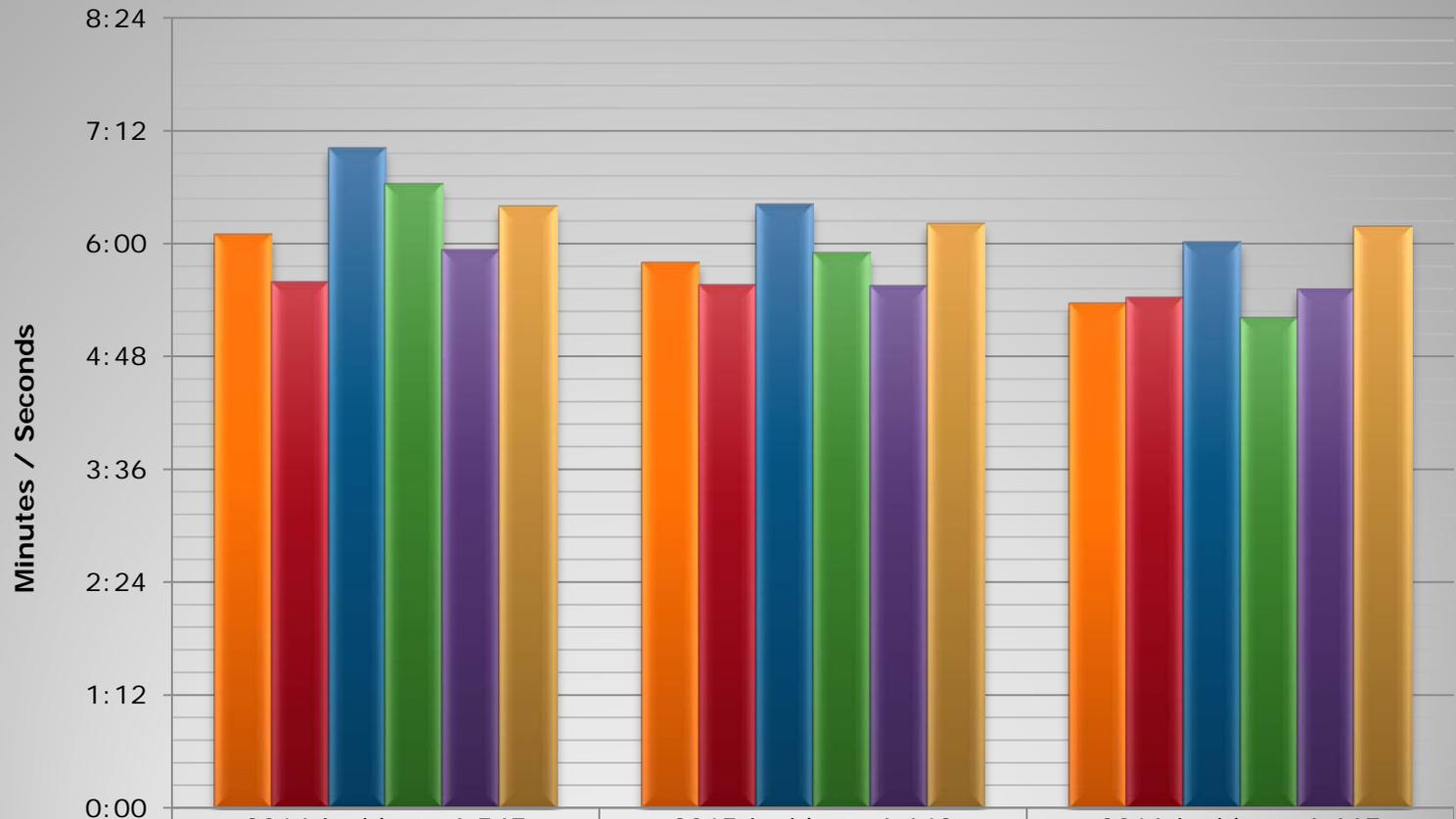


- Review 2014 to present
 - Took aggressive approach to training our personnel as well as educating our citizens.



- 2014
 - 6,547 Incidents
 - 4,762 were medical related
- 2015
 - 6,642 Incidents
 - 4,810 were medical related
- 2016
 - 6,667 Incidents
 - 4,781 were medical related
- 2017
 - 3,718 Incidents so far this year
 - 2,171 were medical related
