


FY2010 All Funds Summary - Expenditures








Personnel Costs




Capital Projects

FY2010 All Funds Summary - Revenues



- •The City's new Single Trash Hauler contract was put into place. Since its April start, 2,160 tons have been recycled.
- •City recognized it's Retiree Health Care obligation and fully funded its obligation making us one of the only communities in Michigan to do so.

Over \$2.2 million of concrete slab replacement is underway throughout the City

- •The rebuilding of Hamlin Road (Crooks Road Livernois Road) is well underway and is on schedule.
- •Dorset Road and Hampton Boulevard Rehabilitation program is planned and should be underway shortly.

- •Austin Avenue will be extended with the help of the *LDFA* and should be completed this year.
- •Construction of the new Cemetery Chapel will begin this year and should be completed by the spring of 2010
- •Fire Station #1 will receive HVAC Improvements this year
- •City's Fleet added a Tractor, a Backhoe, a Vactor Jet Truck and a Dump truck
- •Fire Department purchased three new ambulances
- •New water main along Austin Dr. (a coordinated project with LDFA) and Brewster Dr.

- The City adopted a Debt Management Policy and a Fund Balance Policy
- Earned the GFOA Distinguished Budget Presentation Award
- •Purchasing Division received their 6th consecutive Achievement of Excellence in Procurement Award. One of 59 Cities in the US
- •2009 Festival of the Hills Fireworks was completely funded by private donations.
- •Safety Committee lowered worker's compensation claims by 27% (saving \$100,000) and reduced worker injuries by over 80% over 2007 levels.

- Employee Wellness Committee started and has raised employee's awareness of the importance of a healthier work force.
- Economic development and redevelopment retained 6 companies retained 480 jobs and attracted 14 new business and 322 jobs to the City.
- Finally, with its local attraction and quality of community life, Rochester Hills was recently named "One of the 100 Best Places to Live" by Relocate America.
