#### HISTORYGAE DATA:

First owners were the Burch family. Mr. Burch was the first lawyer for the Village of Rochester. Sold in approx. 1931 to John and Anne Burns. John being an architect of some renown and his wife, Anne, an antique dealer. Antiques were tofinished in the old barn (or shed) close by. Mr. and Mrs. Burns restored woodwork, etc., and added a kitchen. Just before World War II the house was sold to the Bultmans. After Mr. Bultman's death the house was sold in 1957 to Dan Hoisica.
