HISTORICAL DATA:

E.C. Kraut farm on 64 acres, known as Fairview Farm, was built about 1902.

The Farm was purchased by the Eddys in 1934 and following major cleaning and restoration, the family moved in two years later.

All out buildings and barns were demolished in 1993 to build the Eddington Farms Subdivision.

First owners were the Burch family. Mr. Burch was the first lawyer for the Village of Rochester. Sold in approx. 1931 to John and Anne Burns, John being an architect of some renown and his wife, Anne, an antique dealer. Antiques were refinished in the old barn (or shed) close by. Mr. and Mrs. Burns restored woodwork, etc., and added a kitchen. Just before World War II the house was sold to the Bultmans. After Mr. Bultman's death the house was sold in 1957 to Dan Holecica. (The Bultmans were the owners of Detroit's famous Frames Restaurant.)

In 1987 a \$2 million addition and improvements were added to the rear portion of this structure for the MercyCare Family Medical Center. This building received the 1993 Earl Borden Historic Preservation Award.

HISTORICAL DATA:

The house was built in 1944 on a 5 acre parcel on Rochester and Auburn Roads, by Mr. & Mrs. George Berklich. The architect was Mr. Jack Burns, Rochester. The George Berklich family lived in the house until 1969 when the land was sold for development. It was originally on the southeast corner of Auburn and Rochester Roads, where the Pat Moran Car Dealer is located. The George Berklich family lived in the house until 1969 when the land was sold for development. The current owners Mr. & Mrs. Louis Berklich moved the house from Rochester Road to its present site, 2371 Livernois Road, Rochester Hills, in August, 1970.

At the time it was moved, an addition the length of back of the house was added-- kitchen, dining area, utility room and pantry. Plans for the addition were drawn up by Louis Berklich, Architect.

The Louis Berklich family moved in the house in 1976.

Excellent exterior condition. Architecturally significant.
