Ms. Hill requested that approval of the ordinance be postponed to allow the City Attorney the opportunity to address some inconsistencies in the proposed wording of the ordinance. Specifically, she noted the following:

- * Eliminating specific references to outdoor fireplaces or barbecue pits.
- * Limiting permitted fuels to dry seasoned fire wood, commercial logs and charcoal.
- * Examining the permitted size and duration of recreational campfires to take into consideration the various vessels that are now used for recreational fires.

City Attorney John Staran agreed with Ms. Hill's suggestions and stated he and Fire Chief Greg Walterhouse would examine the issues further and return to Council with the changes at a later date.

A motion was made by Hill, seconded by Raschke, that this matter be Adopted by Resolution.

Resolved that the City Council of Rochester Hills hereby POSTPONES acceptance for second reading and adoption of an Ordinance to amend Section 58-58 of Chapter 58, Fire Prevention and Protection of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Rochester Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, to modify open burning regulations concerning recovery of restitution for violations, repeal conflicting ordinances and prescribe a penalty for violation.

Ms. Deb Millhouse, Deputy Director of Planning/Development, briefly described the condominium development under consideration, specifically noting the preservation area designed to maintain the number of required regulated trees and to allow the planting of replacement trees.

Mr. George Ostrowski, Landscape Architect for Nowak & Fraus, 1310 Stephenson Highway, Royal Oak, Michigan, explained that the development was designed with individual driveways for each condominium on Bloomer Road, rather than a single-entrance cul-desac, to comply with the City's tree preservation ordinance.

A motion was made by Hill, seconded by Duistermars, that this matter be Adopted by Resolution.

Resolved that the Rochester Hills City Council hereby approves the Preliminary Plan for Bloomer Park Estates (City File No. 04-007), a four (4) unit site condominium development on 1.82 acres located on the north side of Bloomer Road, east of John R, and south of Bloomer Park, zoned R-4 (One Family Residential) and known as Parcel Number 15-13-151-019, based on the preliminary plan dated received by the Planning Department on June 4, 2004 with the following findings and subject to the following condition.

Findings:

- 1. The preliminary plan meets all applicable requirements of the Zoning Ordinance and the One-Family Residential Detached Condominiums Ordinance.
- 2. Adequate utilities are currently available to properly service the proposed development.
- 3. The preliminary plan represents a reasonable and acceptable plan for developing the property.
- 4. The preliminary plan represents a reasonable lot layout and orientation. In addition, all units have access to an existing roadway.
- 5. The Environmental Impact Statement shows that this development will have no substantially harmful effects on the environment.

CONDITION:

1. The Master Deed/Bylaws indicate that the natural preservation area is limited in its use to passive recreation activities and that signs denoting it as a natural preservation area are to be placed selectively around the edge of the area.
