

Safety Tips

- Keep all lighters and matches out of reach of children.
- Never use a generator indoors or in a garage and keep it away from vents.
- Never store gasoline in the basement or house.
- Place smoke detectors near bedrooms and on every level of your home.
- If you sleep with your bedroom door closed, have a smoke detector in the bedroom.
- Check your smoke detectors monthly and replace them after 10 years.
- Change smoke detector batteries at least once a year.
- Have a carbon monoxide detector in your home. Preferably on every level of your home.
- Never leave cooking unattended—even just for a minute.
- Do not use your cook-top as a temporary countertop to set groceries, etc., reserve it for cooking only.
- Keep children away from the stove while cooking. Create a 3 foot safe zone around the stove.
- Unplug small appliances when not in use.
- Turn pot handles inward while cooking.
- Do not overload outlets.
- Use a power-strip with a circuit beaker.
- Create a fire escape plan and practice it every six months.
- Make sure your house address is clearly visible from the street.

While each scenario can be stressful, cell phone technology is making it possible for emergency personnel to help alleviate one aspect of this anxiety. By participating in the ICE program, you will make it possible for emergency personnel to reach your emergency contact person if you are unable to do so yourself. Please read further to find out what this program is, and how you can make it work for you......

In Case of Emergency Help us help you...

The Rochester Hills, Auburn Hills, Oakland Township and Rochester Fire Departments are joining the nationally recognized ICE (In Case of Emergency) program for cell phones---but we need your help. Imagine that you are in the midst of some emergency and unable to speak for yourself and you need a family member contacted. If emergency personnel know who to contact, they can make that call for you. The concept of the ICE program is that if you store the letters "ICE" prior to the emergency contact name in your cell phone, emergency personnel will know who to contact on your behalf.

This program originated as a way to help emergency personel locate next of kin for a victim who is unconscious, or unable to respond to questions. It is a very simple and easy program that can be an enormous help at the time of an emergency.

How To Program Your Phone

- 1. Open the phonebook in your cell phone.
- 2. Select "add contact".
- 3. Under "Name", type ICE-then enter the name of your emergency contact person.
- 4. Add the phone number as you normally would.

Example:

To list a single contact person, under "Name" you would list: ICE Mary To list multiple contacts, under "Name" you would list: ICE 1 Mary, ICE 2 Tom, ICE 3 Jane, for as many contacts as you wish to include.
