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# MISSION

#### Rochester Hills, Michigan

Expose local Youth to the workings of local municipal government through committee attendance and participation.

#### **EXISTING PROGRAM**

- Serve on Communication Committees.
- Participate in discussion.
- Periodically report to City Council.

#### **PROPOSED CHANGES**

- Create separate Youth Council which will meet monthly
- City Council Vice President to serve as a Liaison between Council and the Youth Council
- One City staff member to support Youth Council

#### PROPOSED CHANGES

- Youth Council to select three projects related to City's Goals and Objectives
  - Council will provide a list for possible projects
  - Additional options may be presented by Youth Council to AIS Committee for approval

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# PROPOSED CHANGES

- Youth-appointed representatives to serve on Council Communication Committees
  - Representation on Committees based on projects selected
  - Individual Selection based on individual strengths and interests
  - Youth Members will be required to attend
     Communication Committees on a quarterly basis;
     may attend additional meetings if they desire

#### PROPOSED CHANGES

- Establish operating budget
- Youth Council and City Council to meet biannually.

#### **PROPOSED CHANGES**

- Selection Process:
  - ✓ Interview Team consisting of One Council Member
    - **✓** One Administrative Staff Member
    - ✓ One Citizen Representative from Communications Committee
    - √ Two Youth Representatives currently serving

#### PROPOSED CHANGES

#### Selection process continued...

- Candidates evaluated based on
  - √ Application quality
  - ✓ Adult reference and interview
  - **✓** Representation
- ✓ Appointment
  - ✓ Interview Team makes recommendation to City Council;
  - ✓ City Council makes appointments

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# **INITIAL GOALS**

- Establish the following:
  - City Council:
    - ✓ Operating structure of the Youth Council
    - ✓ Provide list of potential projects to Youth
  - Youth Council:
    - ✓ Bylaws, Rules and Procedures
    - **✓ Attendance Policy**
    - √ Officers
    - **✓ Committee Appointments**
    - ✓ Select three projects related to City's Goals

#### **City Council Decisions**

- Grade/Age of participants?
  - Recommendation from other communities:
    - ✓ Freshmen/Sophomores
  - Staff recommendation:
    - ✓ Sophomores/Juniors/Seniors
- > For your consideration:
  - Can be redefined once program is established and recruitment increases.

# **City Council Decisions**

- How many members?
  - Recommendation from other communities:
    - ✓ No more than 15 members
  - Staff recommendation:
    - ✓ 13 members
- > For your consideration:
  - ✓ Manageable at 13 members (current year).
    - √ Two from each Council District
    - **✓ Five At-large members**

# **City Council Decisions**

- Length of Terms?
  - Recommendation from other communities:
    - ✓ Two-Year Terms
  - Staff recommendation:
    - One-Year Terms with the opportunity for reappointment;
    - ✓ Maximum serving two years
- > For your consideration:
  - ✓ Two-year term promote continuity.

# **City Council Decisions**

- Youth Council Budget?
  - Recommendation from other communities:
    - From \$500 to \$8,000 annually
  - Staff recommendation:
    - √ \$1,200 annually
      - ✓ Budget will cover such items as T-shirts, mailings/postage, food, swearing-in ceremony, orientation, conferences, miscellaneous projects.
    - Staff will pursue possible funding options through grants and foundations
