## **Response to City Council Questions**

- 1. Can a trailer be placed on the vacant lot next to Fire Station #4 to accommodate housing of additional firefighers?
  - Based on City Attorney John Staran's interpretation, City Ordinance will allow a trailer, temporary or longer term, to be placed on the vacant lot as long as it is for municipal use. John is checking into possible deed restriction at station #4.
  - Please see Chief Canto's response provided
- 2. Does the ordinance allow for a longer term (not necessarily temporary) trailer to be placed on this vacant lot?
  - Based on City Attorney John Staran's interpretation, City Ordinance will allow a trailer, temporary or longer term, to be placed on the vacant lot as long as it is for municipal use. John is checking into possible deed restriction at station #4.
- 3. How were the designs pared down from the original design bid, and where were the savings had, if any?

- 4. If the issue is staff housing, at which stations can trailers be placed to provide adequate sleeping quarters?
  - Based on City Attorney John Staran's interpretation, City Ordinance will allow a temporary trailer to be placed on existing fire station properties as long as it is for municipal use. If the trailers are going to be for a longer term, we will need to check into possible deed restriction at all stations.

- 5. Are the contractors willing to hold bids for another week or two?
  - All contractors have agreed to hold their bid prices until October 21st.
- 6. Request for Mr. Sawdon to provide a written explanation as to where the funding will come from for Station #4.

  - Please note the Funding Options indicate a new total construction cost of \$11,780,000. This total includes the \$165,000 approved by City Council for the George W.
