SUBJECT: Professional Engineering Services for Water System Regulatory Reporting Requirements

REQUEST:

City Council is requested to authorize a contract/blanket purchase order for professional engineering services to assist the City with completing our water system regulatory reporting requirements to Hubbell, Roth & Clark (HRC), Inc., Bloomfield Hills, Michigan in the amount not-to-exceed \$59,900.00 and further authorizes the Procurement Manager to execute the agreement on behalf of the City.

REASON FOR PURCHASE:

HRC is one of the City's selected on-call professional engineering firms that was selected through a request for proposal process and assists the City as-needed with varying projects. HRC is being recommended to assist the City in providing professional engineering services related to mandated updates that are required to be made to the City's water system studies and regulatory reporting requirements. HRC works closely with the City on many of their water service related projects, and has the best overall understanding of our system which is why we are recommending they assist us in this process.

Recent revisions to Michigan's Safe Drinking Water Act (MI-SDWA) and the America's Water Infrastructure Act (AWIA) have placed additional obligations on water supply systems, including the need for self-assessments, updated asset management programs, and lead and copper rule revisions. To address these increased requirements, HRC is proposing to assist the City by streamlining the work necessary to complete the regulatory reporting. This streamlining involves coordinating with the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) to align the submission of these reporting requirements. By working closely with EGLE, HRC aims to minimize duplication of effort, ensuring that the City does not have to provide the same information on multiple reporting platforms. This coordination is intended to save time and resources for the City while still fulfilling all regulatory obligations.

The specific services to be provided by HRC include updates to the Water Reliability Study and General Plan, as well as updates to the Risk and Resilience Assessment (RRA) and the Emergency Response Plan (ERP). These updates are crucial for the City to maintain compliance with state and federal regulations, ensure the reliability and safety of the water system, and plan for future needs.
