SUBJECT: Pathway Millage

City Council, at its regular meeting held Wednesday, August 2, 2006, authorized the placement of a millage proposal for up to 0.1858 mills over the next ten (10) years on the November 7, 2006 General Election ballot for the purpose of continuing the Non-Motorized Pathway Plan, for completing the next group of major sections and to link pathways to major uses. Council further directed City Attorney John Staran to prepare the proposed ballot language to be reviewed and approved by City Council at a subsequent regular meeting.

Mr. Staran has provided the following two (2) options as ballot language.

(OPTION 1)

Pathway Millage

Shall the City of Rochester Hills levy a new millage of up to 0.1858 mill (\$0.1858 per \$1,000 of taxable value) on the taxable value of all property assessed for taxes in the City for a period of ten (10) years, beginning in 2006, and continuing through 2015, inclusive, to establish, construct, maintain and repair pathways and surfaces for use by bicycles, non-motorized vehicles and pedestrians along main, arterial and collector roads and on trailways and to create linkages to pathways, schools and destinations in the City? If approved, this millage will replace the previously authorized 0.2 mill pathway millage which has expired. The estimated amount of revenue that will be collected in the first full year if the millage is authorized and levied in full is \$669,200.00.
