15. REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

15a. Community Development & Viability Committee

(i) Adoption of Rezoning Notification Signs Policy (A0489) (Members received a copy of a Regular Meeting Action Summary Sheet dated February 5, 2003, from Lisa K. DeLeary, Administrative Secretary, Clerk's Office, with attachments)

Member Duistermars questioned whether this type of notification could be implemented for other issues such as public hearings before the Planning Commission.

Member Barnett stated the Community Development & Viability (CDV) Committee could review that matter. He suggested the proposed rezoning notification policy be established first to determine its effectiveness. He indicated the proposal was a first step in attempting to improve communication with the residents. He noted although the City's current communication process met the State requirements in notifying up to three hundred (300') feet in rezoning requests, complaints had been received about the process. He stated the neighboring communities utilized signs, and the posting of signs would allow anyone passing the property to obtain a telephone number and contact person to ask questions.

Member Duistermars agreed this was a good step forward, and suggested the possibility of posting other issues be explored further at the CDV level.

President Dalton stated Agenda Item **15a(ii)** (Adoption of Resolution adding Youth Council Representatives) would be discussed later in the meeting as the expected Youth Representatives had not arrived at this time.

16. <u>ADMINISTRATION</u>

16a. MIS/City Council - Discussion regarding computer needs for City Council

Mr. Krajewski stated he expected Director Bob Grace, MIS Department, and some representatives from Sequoia Services, a networking consulting firm, to arrive shortly.

President Dalton recessed the Regular City Council Meeting at 7:54 PM

Due to the fact all parties had not arrived for either **Agenda Item 15a(ii)** or **16a**, President Dalton recessed the Regular City Council Meeting. Upon consensus, Council Members convened in Closed Session. A separate record was kept of those proceedings.

President Dalton reconvened the Regular City Council Meeting at 8:19 PM

President Dalton stated Council would continue with **Agenda Item 16a** (MIS/City Council Discussion Regarding Computer Needs for City Council), as the parties for **Agenda Item 15a(ii)** had not arrived.

16a. MIS/City Council - Discussion regarding computer needs for City Council

Mr. Krajewski distributed an outline of discussion items for use by Council Members during the discussion.

Mr. Krajewski introduced Doug Arceo and Joe Whelan, Sequoia Services Group, and stated the MIS Department would like to discuss Council's computer needs. He stated he would like to update Council on the auditorium setup once the renovations were complete, and provide some suggestions and ideas for improving Council's access to City information.

Mr. Krajewski stated a CIP project was being prepared for internet hosting services to enhance the capabilities for posting on the internet. He indicated the City's website was currently hosted by a service in California at a cost of approximately Six Hundred (\$600.00) Dollars per year. He stated the City Departments would like to provide more information on the internet, and noted the recent MIS Survey indicated an interest in providing much more information than was currently being provided. He indicated that would mean the City would have to host its own services on the internet, either directly on the City's site or through a hosting service provider.

Mr. Krajewski explained the services the City would like to enhance would be security services involved with internet hosting, and potentially hosting servers and applications as well, through an agreement with a third party.

Member Golden questioned the potential cost of such a project. Mr. Krajewski stated the costs were undetermined at this time, noting technology changed quickly. He explained the costs would be projected in a future CIP project, and would depend on what was included in the project. He indicated the website could be improved, redesigned, reorganized and hosted for under a thousand dollars a year. He stated allowing access to in-house data in "real time"

fashion, or the ability to submit permits on line, was more complicated and would increase the cost.

Member Robbins questioned the reason for requiring the link permit to be secure, noting completing a form for submission to a Department over the internet should not have to require a secure encryption. Mr. Krajewski stated he did not mean to infer a secure encryption webset for those types of transactions was needed. He explained he was referring to opening up the City's internet patch to outside access.

Mr. Grace stated the current discussion was laying the infrastructure for suggestions made by the Departments for handling transactions on-line and increasing the customer service area. Mr. Krajewski discussed the requirements necessary to increase customer services transactions through the City's website. He explained the City did not currently have an addressable internet connection, but was outbound only. He indicated if an addressable internet connection were implemented, an outside server would be required. Mr. Grace stated one (1) employee currently spends a considerable amount of time ensuring the security of the servers and the network. He explained once the system was "opened up", the security level would increase drastically, which could require hiring a security person or hiring that function out to a third party.

Member Robbins stated the option of renting a server and a third party's data center, which would still allow the City to maintain full control, full configuration and full access, should be explored. He noted the cost of simple web hosting could be decreased from the City's current rates. He suggested it would be helpful to have VPN access to an internal internet site, allowing public records to be reviewed. Mr. Krajewski stated the City's site was currently very secure, although the next step could present some security issues.

Member Golden noted there were some City records that were required to be secure, such as the Water Department, the Fire Department and Public Safety. She stated it would be helpful for residents to be able to complete forms and questionnaires, although the method of obtaining signatures would have to be addressed. She felt this could be accomplished fairly inexpensively.

Mr. Grace stated the internet hosting would be for the Departments to allow for better access and provide more information to the residents. He explained currently Equalizer was paid to host the City's tax and land file information, at a cost of approximately Thirteen Thousand (\$13,000.00) Dollars. He noted if the infrastructure was in place, the City would have to determine if it would be more cost effective to host that service itself. He indicated the Departments were interested in expanding customer service through the internet, thereby reducing telephone and counter traffic.

Member Golden questioned whether the Sheriff's Department would be included, noting they currently had a separate County computer, and a City computer. Mr. Grace stated discussions had been held with the Sheriff's Department to determine if communication was necessary between them and the City, other than e-mail access. He noted the majority of the employees were County employees; utilized the City's computer to access Outlook and e-mail, and they were not really sharing data with anyone at the City. He stated the Sheriff's Department would also be moving to another location, which could present some communication issues. Mr.

Krajewski indicated remote site access was being evaluated for the Sheriff's Department, as well as for the museum and some of the parks locations.

Member Golden noted Council Meeting packets were currently available on the City's website, as well as meeting minutes, and questioned whether space was limited. Mr. Krajewski indicated the City had just over 300 mgs on the website, which was the limit at this time. Member Golden suggested that type of information should be archived and available for research. Mr. Krajewski indicated the implementation of the Legistar system would provide that information, although it would be in-house only at the present time.

Member Golden noted Council Members currently could not access the City's intranet without using the laptops. She questioned whether access could be provided through personally owned computer equipment.

Mr. Krajewski stated the MIS Department would like Council Members to identify their needs. He noted the renovated auditorium would include computer stations, negating the use of the laptops by Council Members during meetings. He noted the age of the laptops, which would have to be replaced if Council Members continued to use them. He stated the MIS Department was reviewing the possibility of utilizing MyPC applications to allow access to Council Members from their home computers. He indicated this would allow Council Members access to City Hall information through a secure connection, while preventing a potential virus contained on a home computer from infecting the City's system. He did not feel that type of security could be maintained through the use of a VPN system.

Member Robbins stated he felt VPN connections could be utilized safely. He noted his employer, Compuware, utilized a VPN system for secure access for all its employees nationwide through the use of log-on scripts.

Mr. Krajewski explained the use of a DSL or cable connection at a Council Member's home would have limited download and upload speeds. He stated the use of a VPN connection would only allow limited access to certain applications due to the decrease in speed.

Mr. Arceo indicated although the VPN systems were very well bossed with a DSL or cable modem connection, if a virus file was not updated properly and was not detected, a VPN connection could potentially infect the system. He noted the speed of a VPN system would depend on the type of application being accessed.

Member Robbins suggested it would be beneficial for residents to be able to purchase birth or death certificates, or dog licenses, over the internet and have them mailed to their home. He stated it would be a benefit to the residents to be able to pay water bills or transact other business without having to come to City Hall in person.

Mr. Krajewski stated on-line payment of water bills would necessitate updated information be available in real time data to avoid duplication of payment. He stated the web server allowing that type of a connection would have to have access through the firewall on the City's system

into the City's internal data. He noted the problems that could be encountered with hackers, compromising the security of the City's internal data.

Member Barnett stated he used his home computer for everything, and noted it was cumbersome to use the laptop to access e-mail or to print an e-mail. Mr. Krajewski stated several applications were being reviewed to allow Council Members easier access to City Hall e-mail and other data. He indicated the use of VPN System could include installing software and other City applications on the home computers, which was not a desirable situation.

Mr. Arceo stated it appeared Council Members had expressed a need to retrieve e-mail through a simpler method, as well as the ability to download packets. Ms. Jasinski noted the packets were currently provided on a CD. Member Duistermars noted many times the packets are quite large. Mr. Grace stated the City would like to reach the point where the packets could be downloaded.

Mr. Arceo stated there were alternatives for e-mail, such as Groupwise, and discussed the process that would be utilized to access such a system.

Mr. Krajewski questioned whether Council Members currently used the City's Outlook program for any applications other than e-mail. He noted if Council Members did not utilize the program, it could be eliminated from future technology needs.

Member Hill agreed it would beneficial for residents to make on-line purchases of items such as licenses or park passes. She questioned the cost of the implementation of that access, as well as the associated maintenance costs. She noted the cost would have to be balanced against the amount of service or use by the residents. She suggested a list of options and costs be compiled, which would allow Council Members to determine how to proceed.

Member Golden stated she would like City Hall information to be available to be accessed by Council Members, such as agreements and the Master Land Use Plan, rather than having to call City Hall and request copies. She suggested consultant reports be submitted electronically. She indicated Council Members could then access information and e-mail responses to resident questions in a more timely fashion. Mr. Krajewski stated the Clerk's Office currently utilized electronic data from outside consultants and other parties in preparing the paperless packets.

Member Duistermars suggested presentations made at Council Meetings or other Board Meetings should be easily viewed by the public. Mr. Krajewski indicated that issue would be addressed with the City Hall Renovation Project.

Member Robbins suggested the laptops be eliminated, and that pagers and cell phones be consolidated. He felt the use of on-line forms could be easily set up in conjunction with a credit card processor. Mr. Grace noted the City currently did not accept credit card payments in City Hall. He stated the recent MIS Survey indicated a desire for those same applications. He indicated the Departments were requested to determine if signatures currently being required for specific transactions were essential to complete the transaction. Member Robbins suggested the Digital Signature Law be reviewed.

Mr. Krajewski clarified the majority of Council Members would prefer to eliminate the use of laptops and be provided access to City Hall data through home computers. President Dalton indicated the majority of Council Members appeared to be in agreement with that proposal.

Mr. Krajewski clarified the majority of Council Members would prefer the MIS Department initially pursue the "lower tech" options for expanding the City's website. He suggested additional options could be explored for inclusion in the 2005 CIP.

President Dalton noted the length of this discussion and indicated Agenda Item 15a(ii) would be addressed as the youth representatives had arrived.

15. REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

15a. Community Development & Viability Committee

(ii) Adoption of Resolution adding Youth Representatives to City Council Communication Committees (A0494) (Members received a copy of a Regular Meeting Action Summary Sheet dated February 6, 2003 from Lisa K. DeLeary, Administrative Secretary, Clerk's Office, with attachments)

Member Barnett stated he had requested members from the Teen Council attend the meeting for this discussion. He indicated he felt this an excellent opportunity for Council to lead other communities in recognizing youth involvement. He noted both parties would benefit from including youth representatives on the City Council Communication Committees. He stated the school districts, as well as Channel 55 and the local newspapers, would be utilized to get the word out to interested applicants.

Theresa Mungioli, 3435 Palm Aire Drive, stated she was the President of the Rochester Auburn Hills Community Coalition. She noted members of the Teen Council were also present with her, as they normally met on Wednesday evenings, and had agreed to move their meeting location to attend this Council meeting. She thanked Council for consideration of this resolution, and stated the teens were looking forward to having an opportunity to serve on the committees. She indicated the teens present represented many of the area high schools, and would help spread the news to help find applicants interested in being involved on the committees. She thanked the Council Members for being a lighthouse Council, indicating she looked forward to spreading the word to the rest of the county about what this Council had done for the youth in the City.

Member Barnett stated he had the opportunity to attend the September, 2002 Michigan Municipal League (MML) Conference with some of the Teen Council members. He felt the teens were an extraordinary group of individuals to work with, and indicated he looked forward to building an expanded working relationship. He thanked the Teen Council members for attending the meeting, and noted the teens had a common goal with one (1) of the communication committees in a community center.

Member Golden welcomed the Teen Council members and stated Council Members looked forward to working with them.

Member Hill questioned whether all the area high schools in the Rochester Hills area were represented on the Teen Council. **Ms. Mungioli** stated the Council was in the process of setting up discussions with the activities director at the Stoney Creek High School. She stated that school was new and had a small number of students.

Member Hill stated it was important that all the Rochester Hills area high schools be allowed the opportunity to participate. She indicated the CDV Committee felt it was important to involve the youth in the community to provide them a sense of the issues the committees discussed, as well as for the committees to learn about the issues the teens dealt with. She noted it would be beneficial to have a cross-representation from all the districts in the community.

President Dalton stated he was supportive of including the youth representatives on the committees. He noted letters had recently been sent to the area high schools seeking teens to attend the March MML Conference being held in Lansing. He indicated the response had been very limited, and requested the Teen Council members bring that information to their school principals and teachers.

Ms. Mungioli stated the Teen Council had been successful in establishing communication with the school principals in Rochester Hills, in particular seeking participants for the Youth Dialog Day. She noted the Youth Dialog Day would be held on April 2, 2003 at the St. John Fisher Chapel. She indicated the Teen Council would remind the school principals about the MML Conference. President Dalton suggested the teens present request their school principals to contact him for information about the MML Conference.

Resolution A0494-2003-R0066

MOTION by Barnett, seconded by Golden,

Whereas at the May 22, 2002 Work Session, City Council directed the Community Development & Viability (CDV) Committee to meet with the members of the Rochester/Auburn Hills Community Coalition to discuss a variety of objectives on partnering with each other.

Whereas at their July 18, 2002 meeting, the CDV Committee met with Ms. Theresa Mungioli, President of the Rochester/Auburn Hills Community Coalition and discussed how the City might utilize area youth in current City processes and involvement on City Committees that are youth related.

Whereas as a first step, area youth recently participated with City Council at the Annual Michigan Municipal League Conference in Dearborn, Michigan. The youth delegates provided City Council with a brief report of their experience at the Convention at the September 25, 2002 Council Meeting.

Whereas it is the interest of the CDV Committee to strengthen the involvement between the local youth and the City, and to encourage youth participation in their Community.

Whereas it is the recommendation of the CDV Committee that Rochester Hills Youth Representatives be added to all five (5) of the City Council Communication Committees, Administration & Information Services (AIS), Community Development & Viability (CDV), Financial Services (FS), Leisure Activities (LA), and Public Safety (PS), as set forth in the following criteria:

- 1. Each year, the School Districts that have Rochester Hills residents attending would be notified of the opportunity for Rochester Hills youth to be involved with the City Council and serve as members on the Communication Committees.
- 2. Interested Rochester Hills youth must submit a letter of interest to serve on a Committee to the City Council Liaison.
- 3. Each Committee shall be responsible for the selection of one (1) Youth Member to serve on the Committee.
- 4. Youth Members must be a resident of the City of Rochester Hills.
- 5. Each Youth Member shall serve for a term of one (1) calendar year.
- 6. Youth Members shall be non-voting members of the Committees.
- 7. Youth Members shall provide reports and/or updates to the City Council, on a quarterly basis, on their school Student or Youth Council and their involvement on the Communication Committee.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the Rochester Hills City Council hereby concurs with the recommendation of the Community Development & Viability Committee and approves the adding of one (1) Rochester Hills Youth Representative to each of the five (5) City Council Communication Committees and requesting that the Committee By-Laws be amended to reflect the change.

Further Resolved, that the City Council President would make the initial contact with the School Districts to advise them of the City's interest to involve the Rochester Hills youth on the Communication Committees.

President Dalton stated the discussion regarding Agenda Item 16a would resume.

16a. MIS/City Council - Discussion regarding computer needs for City Council

Mr. Krajewski indicated the prior discussion had resulted in many good ideas and suggestions about future computer needs. He stated the benefits of utilizing a VPN versus another type of program, such as Go-To-MyPC, would be reviewed and researched. He noted the benefit of utilizing a program that did not require the installation and maintenance of software on home computers, which could become problematic for the MIS Department to support.

Mr. Krajewski stated the situation regarding remote sites would have to be addressed. He indicated the installation of DSL Lines and the potential use of a program such as Go-To-MyPC would be evaluated for those locations as well.

Mr. Krajewski noted the standard network upgrade would be included as a CIP Project, due to the fact the last upgrade was implemented in January, 2001. He stated that would include review of server capabilities such as consolidation or replacement.

Mr. Grace discussed the implementation of a data replication program for disaster recovery purposes. He explained Chief Walterhouse had requested the Department Directors and Administration to review their business processes to determine what could be maintained in the event the computer system was not available. He stated as the various processes and operations were identified, the MIS Department would determine the level of disaster recovery that would be necessary. Mr. Krajewski stated the possibility of data replication at an offsite location was being reviewed, such as at the main Fire Station or the DPS Garage.

Mr. Krajewski thanked Council Members for their input, and thanked the representatives from Sequoia Services for attending the meeting.

16b. <u>Discussion</u> regarding a resolution on "The Clinton River in Rochester and Rochester Hills: A Greenway Opportunity Plan.

President Dalton stated he had received a request from Jerry Carvey regarding the Clinton River Greenway Opportunity Plan. He explained Mr. Carvey had requested Council provide a resolution of support of the plan.

Member Hill noted no information had been provided to Council Members to consider the request. President Dalton suggested if Council was receptive to the idea, a resolution could be prepared and presented at the next Regular Council Meeting.

Member Hill indicated the Plan had not been presented to Council Members at this time. President Dalton indicated Mr. Carvey had proposed a lengthy resolution for consideration, noting it appeared Council supported his presentation, but was not prepared to support the Plan prior to receiving the Plan.

Member Hill requested a copy of Mr. Carvey's proposed resolution be provided to Council Members for review.

Member Golden suggested this matter be scheduled for a future Council Work Session, noting there were other issues that should be included in the discussion. She stated there were several groups working on several related issues, such as open space, the corridor, and a possible ballot proposal. She stated the City of Rochester had recently adopted a resolution of support.

Member Hill suggested Council Members be provided a copy of the resolution passed by the City of Rochester, along with Mr. Carvey's proposed resolution. Member Golden indicated she had another proposed resolution regarding the open space issue, which was currently under review by the CDV Committee.

Member Barnett stated the open space Millage proposal was still being reviewed by a focus group; however, had been set back while the presentation for the Clinton River Trail was being prepared.

Member Golden noted there were different open space issues other than the greenway and the Clinton River Trail. She indicated she would provide a list of the outstanding issues to President Dalton for scheduling at a future Council Work Session, along with a proposed resolution regarding another issue.

Member Hill stated the CDV Committee had determined an open space group had been formed as a result of the Speak Out process; however, the group had focused on the Clinton River Corridor first. She understood that group would approach the other areas as time permitted. She felt the information provided by Mr. Carvey regarding the Clinton River Corridor could be discussed further at the CDV Committee level.

President Dalton indicated a Council Work Session would be scheduled upon receipt of the additional information.

17. COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS

No Council Committee reports were presented.

18. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

President Dalton suggested Council Members might be interested in touring the addition at the City Hall Municipal Building to review the progress of the construction to date. He indicated if Council Members were interested, a tour would be scheduled for March 12, 2003 prior to the Regular Council Meeting. He noted it was a construction site and appropriate precautions would have to be taken.

Mayor Somerville noted at the present time, it was anticipated the employees would compress into the new addition at the end of May, 2003.

Member Hill noted the MML Conference conflicted with the March 26, 2003 Regular City Council Meeting, and questioned whether that meeting would be cancelled.
