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# Planning Commission Special Meeting Discussion on Oil & Gas Drilling DRAFT Ordinance

March 24, 2015



- 1. City Council has extended the 6 month moratorium
- 2. Public Hearing tonight
- 3. If Planning Commission is agreeable with proposed ordinances, recommend adoption to City Council
- 4. City Council will hold 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> readings & adopt ordinances (with or without modifications)

Note: Oil & Gas Ordinance is an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance, & the Pipelines Ordinance is an amendment to Chapter 94 of the City's Codified Ordinances





# 1. Restrict oil & gas wells to Industrial Zoning as a permitted use

Clarifies that processing, storage & refining are conditional uses in the Industrial district

2. The setback for oil & gas wells has been increased to 1,000 feet from residential dwellings, places of worship, schools, hospitals, child care center & public parks Expressly states that this does not restrict or prohibit underground horizontal or directional drilling, which is what Auburn Hills has in its Ordinance





### Proposed Ordinance Key Changes

- 3. In addition to providing a copy of the EIA that the well owner/operator files with the MDEQ, the owner/operator must provide the City with a hydro-geological study & must install at least 1 groundwater monitoring well & must provide the City with test sample results (consistent with the new Supervisor of Wells Instruction)
- 4. Perimeter fence must be at least 6 feet high
- 5. All operations must be conducted in accordance with MDEQ's "best practices" in regard to odor, dust, noise & nuisance control
- 6. Exterior lighting must be shielded & comply with Zoning Ordinance exterior lighting standards
- 7. The well owner/operator must conform to the Performance Standards in the Zoning Ordinance regarding dust, odors, noise, etc.





#### Proposed Ordinance Key Changes

- 8. Completed well head structure is limited to 22" in height
- Measures or controls must be satisfactory to the City Engineer regarding drainage, run-off or discharge of hazardous materials, no off-site discharge of stormwater is allowed except to an approved drainage system
- 10. All brine, mud, wastewater, chemicals & waste must be properly disposed of to prevent infiltration or damage to any water wells, wetlands & watercourses
- 11. Injection wells are prohibited
- 12. The site must be kept in a clean & orderly condition





#### Proposed Ordinance Key Changes

- 13. Landscaping to limit public view must be provided in accordance with the City's landscape & screening requirements, a Type E buffer must be provided
- 14. The City Engineer must approve roads & routes for trucks & equipment traffic
- 15. The well owner/operator must provide emergency contact information & an emergency response plan
- 16. Hydraulic fracturing ("fracking") is prohibited
