

RE: Mayor's Org Chart

This memo is in response to Council Member Hill's inquiry at the City Council meeting on Wednesday September 22, 2004, as to the organizational structure in the 2005 Proposed Budget Plan Document. It is my understanding that the question was raised as to why the Finance Director or Fiscal division was structured under the Mayor rather than the City Administrator.

The "Functional City-wide Organizational Chart" (attached) in the Plan Document (page 1) illustrates that the Finance function is under the City Administrator. The purpose of this organizational chart is to demonstrate the relationship between all departments within the City.

The Mayor's "Departmental Organizational Chart" (attached) in the Plan Document (page 109) purpose is to illustrate the relationship between positions within the Mayor's Department. The organizational chart's linking/stacking demonstrates that the City Administrator and Mayor are both over the Finance Director and the rest of the department's staff.




