MUSEUM OPERATIONS UPDATE - Pat McKay

Pat McKay updated the group. They have been working on their disaster plan, including fire extinguisher training. They also had a few rain incidents which ended up flooding the basement of the Equipment Barn 2 times within a few weeks. The gardens have been growing well because of all the rain. Many maintenance items were taken care of this summer.

MUSEUM UPDATES - Cathy Fitzpatrick

Cathy Fitzpatrick discussed Wet and Wild Wednesdays. They have made some tweaks to the parking situation. Week one they had over 900 people, week two was cancelled due to rains, weeks 3 and 4 had awesome turnouts too. She also mentioned that more people are paying with credit cards for programs than with cash. Many programs have run successfully year after year. She discussed community partnerships and new experiences and programs. She also discussed summer camp; campers suggested having a camp for older kids. Vintage Base Ball is always a success as well. Fitzpatrick discussed upcoming events.

Pat McKay discussed the History Minute. Morris Place visited recently. His father was the farm manager at the Van Hoosen Farm for nearly 50 years. He donated a milk bottle carrier on his most recent visit. Morris is 88 years old now. McKay also mentioned another donation, an 1818 chest of drawers that was originally in the Van Hoosen Farmhouse. He also mentioned his trip to pick up more of the Broomfield collection back in May. Discussion ensued.

OLD BUSINESS

Discussion regarding 2024 -2025 Endowment Fundraising Campaign.

Pat McKay suggested a fall membership volunteer night to show appreciation for the volunteers. He suggested celebrating 45 years of the Museum. We are asking for some money from City Council for updates to things such as lighting. There are not many "showy" things that we are looking to improve at this point. This summer they focused on acquiring more members through programs such as Wet & Wild Wednesdays.

Suzanne Wiggins discussed why endowment is important. Pat McKay discussed donor lists and where those names come from. Out current lists are people that are either members already or visit the museum for programs. McKay mentioned testimonials for a media campaign. Carol Morlan mentioned that every community has a unique story and Rochester Hills is incredible, she would not have known as much without being a part of the Board. Discussion ensued.

Bryan Barnett discussed things you need to be successful in a fundraising campaign. How do we spread this message; how do we take it to the next level? We have the support and have done well with the resources we currently have. He thinks the number is right and the impact will be pretty dramatic. Heather Sellick mentioned a matching collaboration with Park Davis or another company. Barnett talked about the connections everyone already has and getting them in contact with Pat McKay to continue discussions. Barnett posed the question "is there one person in your life that you could introduce to Pat?" Discussion ensued.
