Description of Proposed Work: A picket fance to enclose A partion of the backgard to stop a toddler from getting out on to Tienken. The fence will start at the rear corners of the house; extend across the side yards to the property lines; then back towards the rear of the property.

### NOTE:

Applicants are required to provide the following information to the Historic Districts Commission at least three (3) weeks prior to the meeting date.

In accordance with Chapter 118, Historical Preservation, of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Rochester Hills, the following information applies:

**Sec. 118-161** *Permission required.* Before construction, alteration, repair, moving or demolition affecting the exterior appearance of a structure, or the construction of a new structure or part thereof, within a Historic District, the person proposing to take such action shall apply for and obtain permission to do so from the Historic Districts Commission. Permission is required regardless of whether a building permit is required.

**Sec. 118-162** *Procedure.* A person seeking to perform work on a resource within a Historic District shall proceed as follows:

- 1. <u>Information for Commission</u>: Any such person shall provide the following information to the Commission at least three (3) weeks prior to the meeting at which the matter is to be considered. All required information submitted shall include the person's name and address. The scale used for plans and drawings shall be indicated in the lower right corner.
- (a) <u>Site plan</u>: Fourteen (14) copies of a site plan drawn to an appropriate scale and describing, dimensioning and identifying all major features including property lines, main buildings, outbuildings, parking areas, drives, walkways, fences, major trees, significant variations in grade elevation, relationship to adjacent streets and structures, and the relationship of major features to property lines. A north point shall be indicated on the plan.
- (b) Plans and elevations for structure: Fourteen (14) copies of plans drawn to scale (minimum scale of one-quarter inch equals one foot for residential, and one-eighth inch equals one foot for commercial) illustrating the entire exterior perimeter of new resources, existing resources on which work is to be done, and any proposed work, together with pertinent dimensions and depiction of major exterior features including doors, windows, bays, porches, architectural trim and elevations. Details pertaining to exterior building materials shall also be provided including types, finishes and colors, kind and size of exterior wall material, and other significant architectural information. A north point shall be indicated on all plans and drawings.
- (c) Other descriptive material: The Commission may consider photographs, research materials or other descriptive information provided.
- 2. <u>Application to building department</u>: A person requesting to do any work on a resource within a Historic District shall apply to the Building Department and make such application by completing a building permit application accompanied by payment of any fees required in Division 1 of Article V of Chapter 54 of this Code. The application shall be accompanied by required plans and drawings.
- 3. <u>Building department review</u>: The Building Department shall review the completed application to ensure the proposed work will comply with applicable setback and other planning, zoning, and environmental requirements and any other applicable Ordinances.

I live in the Rochester Stoney Creek Historic district on Tienken Road - 1050 Tienken.

Our home was built approximately in 1846.

I need to build a fence in my backyard to contain my 2 year old boy & stop him from running out to the front and onto Tienken Road.

Here is a Description of work:

The fence will be a picket fence.


The fence will be constructed from natural wood – cedar.

The fence will be similar to the other natural wood fences in the district. (960 Tienken; 1002 Tienken; 1045 Tienken;...)

There will be 3 gates - constructed from pieces of the same panels that the fence is built from.

The posts will be plain – similar to the posts at the historic school.

The fenceline will proceed from near the rear corners of the house sideways to the property line; go towards the back of the property 1 foot inside the property line - parallel to the property line; the fence will turn/branch at 90 degrees to connect to the side of the outhouse and brick shed in the back of the property. Gates will be added where it makes sense.
