HISTORICAL DATA:

The house was built in1944 on a 5 acre parcel on Rochester Road, Avon Township, Rochester, by Mr. & Mrs. George Berklich. The architect was Mr. Jack Burns, Rochester. The George Berklich family lived in the house until 1969 when the land was sold for development. It was originally on the southeast corner of Auburn and Rochester Roads, where the Pat Moran Car Dealer is located.

The George Berklich family lived in the house until 1969 when the land was sold for development. The current owners Mr. & Mrs. Louis Berklich moved the house from Rochester Road to its present Site, 2371 Livernois Road, Rochester, August, 1970.

Excellent exterior condition. Architecturally significant. for the addition were drawn up by Louis Berklich, Architect. The Louis Berklich family moved in the house 1976 and are presently living there.

PREFACE

Act 169, as enacted by the Michigan Legislature in 1970, states in Section 2:

"The purpose of the ordinance is to: (a) Safeguard the heritage of the local unit by preserving a district in a local government which reflects elements of its culture, social, economic, political or architectural history; (b) stabilize and improve property values in such district; (c) foster civic beauty; (d) strengthen the local economy; and, (e) promote the use of historic districts for the education, pleasure and welfare of the citizens of the local unit and of the State."

To implement these objectives, the Act spells out in detail the means of achieving a Historic District status, namely: first, by gathering facts through a Study Committee; and, secondly, by activating a permanent administrative body, called a Historic District Commission. This Study covers only the first phase of the process.

In approaching the Study, the Committee was fortunate in being able to call on other communities for guidance, such as Franklin Village, Romeo, Warren, Troy, Waterford, Detroit, Ann Arbor, and others, who have attained Historic District Status. Assistance was also obtained from Robert E. Miller, Historic Preservation Coordinator, State of Michigan, Michigan History Division - Lansing.




