SUBJECT: Appointment of 2009/2010 Rochester Hills Government Youth Council

City Council at its Regular Meeting of March 16, 2005 adopted Resolution RES0080-2005 establishing the Rochester Hills Government Youth Council (RHGYC) to promote youth involvement in local government through active participation and the mutual exchange of ideas and experiences. The RHGYC composition includes thirteen (13) members appointed by City Council following the established Application/Appointment Process, which will consist of (2) representatives from each City Council District and five (5) at-large representatives.

This year we are very pleased to mention that we received 25 applications that met the minimum qualifications to be considered. Of the 25 applications received, seven (7) were from current Youth Council members requesting to be re-appointed to an additional term on the Council.

The established Application/Appointment process included the following:

- Submission of application packet by interested students which included the following:
 - Application
 - Essay Questions
 - Two Letters of Recommendation
- Interviews by the Interview Team consisting of City Council Member Vern Pixley, City Clerk Jane Leslie, City Council Coordinator Leanne Scott, and two (2) Senior Youth Representatives, Samuel Kilberg and Regina Wong, who are currently serving on the Youth Council

All twenty-five students participated in the interview process. The interview team evaluated the candidates on application quality, adult references, interview and representation.

While we are very happy to see the large number of students interested in serving on the RHGYC, it makes the final selection process very difficult. Each applicant was extremely bright and pleasant, and could bring something different and unique to the group. IN the end, however, the Interview Team took into account the composition of the RHGYC (district representation), school representation and the number in each graduating year, and we are recommending to Council that they appoint fifteen students to the Youth Council again this year. This will allow the seven returning students to mentor the eight new students. The eight new students are an equitable representation of Council Districts and grades, allowing for ongoing participation and mentoring within the program. The terms of office will be fore one (1) year coinciding with the school calendar year beginning on September 1, 2009 and expiring on August 31, 2010.

If all fifteen students are appointed, the representation would be as follows:
