Local champions and top performers

Seaholm's Jackson Vance took home the 140-pound title by defeating Clarkston's Ethan Polick. Vance qualified for states in the 125-pound weight class last season.

"He's only a sophomore and has now placed twice in county. He has been wrestling all his life. He is one of the hardest-working guys in the room and a leader. He was two points away from placing in state last year. He was the first freshman at Seaholm to make it to state in the 28 years I've been at Seaholm. He could be a multiple state placer," Seaholm coach Neil Tuomi said.

Stoney Creek's Andy Hampton claimed the 112-pound class with a win over Bashi. Bashi finished fourth in the state in the 103-pound weight class last season.

Rochester's Kavan Troy was able to defeat Ferndale's Dylan Coleman to claim the 103-pound championship.

Other top performances included Groves' Damon Dunbar finishing second at 152; Avondale's Torey Coleman placing third at 145; Royal Oak's Earle Weaver taking third at 160; North Farm-

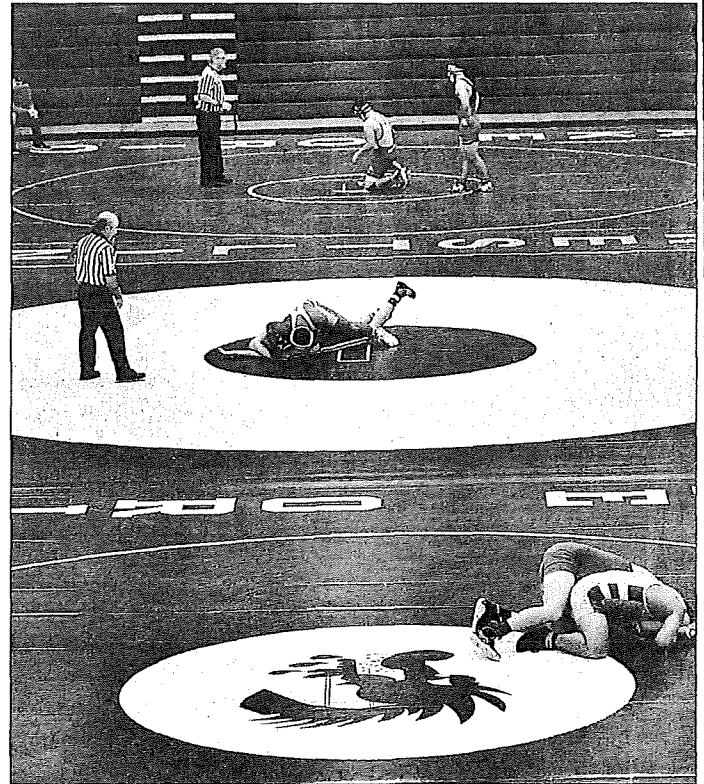

OAKLAND COUNTY WATER RESOURCES COMMISSIONER NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGREEMENT TO ENLARGE THE IRELAND DRAIN DRAINAGE DISTRICT

Jim Nash, Water Resources Commissioner for the County of Oakland, Michigan, acting for and on behalf of the IRELAND DRAIN Drainage District, has received a request to add 2.04 acres to the existing IRELAND DRAIN Drainage District.

The IRELAND DRAIN Drainage District at present contains approximately 852 acres. There is capacity in the existing IRELAND DRAIN to serve the lands to be added without detriment to or diminution to the IRELAND DRAIN Drainage District.

Proceedings have been undertaken according to the provisions of Section 280.433, Chapter 18 of Act No. 40 of the Michigan Drain Code of 1956, as amended, to enlarge the IRELAND DRAIN Drainage District.

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given that it is the intention of the IRELAND DRAIN Drainage District to enter into an agreement providing for the addition of the following described lands to the IRELAND DRAIN Drainage District.

A parcel of land in the SW ¼ of Section 25, T.3N., 11E., City of Rochester Hills, Oakland County, Michigan is more particularly described as: Commencing at the SW corner of Section 25; thence N.00°04'45"E., 1320.00 feet along the west line of Section 25 and the centerline of John R Road; thence N.89°25'45"E., 60.00 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence N.00°04'45"E., 330.00 feet along the east line of John R Road (120 feet wide); thence N.89°25'45"E., 270.01 feet; thence S.00°04'45"W., 330.00 feet; thence S.89°25'45"W., 270.01 feet to the Point of Beginning and containing 2.04 acres.
