Discussion regarding possible Joint Meeting with City of Rochester City Council and Oakland Township Board of Trustees regarding Older Persons' Commission (OPC) Issues

President Hill explained that the purpose of the Special Meeting was to discuss the possibility of City Council hosting a joint meeting with the elected officials of the City of Rochester and Oakland Township to discuss the apparent impasse the three communities find themselves in with regards to permitting residents under the age of 60 years to utilize some of the services of the Older Persons Commission (OPC). President Hill noted that no action would be taken at the proposed joint meeting, but rather it would be a forum for open discussion of the matter.

Council members expressed the following issues and concerns with regard to the suggested joint meeting and issue at hand:

- * Perhaps a smaller group of elected officials could meet, similar to the Sister City Committees already in place, rather than all elected officials, which would be difficult to manage.
- * A previous suggestion that a subcommittee consisting of representatives from the three communities be created to address this issue was rejected because it was felt that the OPC Board should be permitted to address such issues.
- * Were a smaller group to meet there is more of a possibility of rumors and misinformation being generated, rather than all members meeting.
- * There is more of an opportunity for "civil and respectful" interaction when all members gather.
- * The City of Rochester is "very agitated" by the State Attorney General's decision not to intervene in this matter with an opinion.
- * The OPC is a public facility and it is Council's duty to see that "it's open to as much of the public" as possible.
- * A joint meeting would be an opportunity to "voice our opinion on how firmly we are committed" to allowing the OPC Board to make decisions regarding facility membership and usage.

A motion was made by Dalton, seconded by Holder, that this matter be Adopted by Resolution.

Resolved that the Rochester Hills City Council requests that the City Clerk's Office contact the City of Rochester City Council and the Oakland Township Board of Trustees to set a Joint Meeting to discuss the Older Persons' Commission (OPC) intergovernmental agreement and related issues.
