AN ORDINANCE TO ADD ARTICLE IV, GEESE MANAGEMENT, TO CHAPTER 14, ANIMALS, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ROCHESTER HILLS, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN, TO PROHIBIT THE FEEDING OF GEESE, LIST EXCEPTIONS, REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES, AND PRESCRIBE A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS.

THE CITY OF ROCHESTER HILLS ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Article IV shall be added to Chapter 14 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Rochester Hills, as follows:

ARTICLE IV. Geese Management

Sec. 14-93 - Findings and purpose.

Increasing complaints about and incidences of geese/human interaction, geese-related diseases and damage to private property, including lakes and ponds make it necessary and appropriate to manage the geese in the City of Rochester Hills. The city council finds that the intentional feeding of geese contributes to an unnaturally large goose population resulting in loss of natural fear of humans, risk of disease, and private property damage. By prohibiting feeding of geese, the city council intends to manage the congregation of geese and improve public safety and quality of life in the city by reducing the occurrence of geese/human interaction, the likelihood of geese related disease, and damage to private property.

Sec. 14-94 - Geese feeding prohibited.

No person may place or permit placement on the ground, or within five (5) feet of the ground, any fruit, berries, grain, vegetables, nuts, salt or other edible material or bait which may reasonably be expected to attract or feed geese unless such materials are covered or protected in a way to prevent geese from feeding on them.

Sec. 14-95 - Exceptions.

The foregoing prohibition of geese feeding does not apply to:

- (1) Naturally growing materials, fruit trees, other trees and shrubs, and live crops, plants, flowers and vegetation;
- (2) Bird feeders; or
- (3) Veterinarians, animal control officers, federal and state game officials and persons authorized by the city or other public authority to treat, manage, count, capture or remove geese.

<u>Section 2</u>. <u>Severability</u>. This ordinance and each article, section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, part, provision, sentence, word and portion thereof are hereby declared to be severable, and if they or any of them are declared to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, it is hereby provided that the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby

<u>Section 3</u>. <u>Penalty</u>. Except as otherwise provided therein, all violations of this ordinance shall be municipal civil infractions and upon a determination of responsibility therefore shall be punishable by a civil fine of \$500.

Section 4. Repeal,	Effective Da	te, Adoption.
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Section 4. Repeat, Directive Date, Adoption.
(1) <u>Repeal</u> . All regulatory provisions contained in other City ordinances, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed.
(2) Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective on, 2024 following its publication in the <i>Oakland Press</i> on, 2024.
(3) <u>Adoption</u> . This ordinance was adopted by the City Council of the City of Rochester Hills at a meeting thereof held on, 2024.
