Please accept this correspondence along with the enclosed Candidate Questionnaire and my resume as notice of my intent to apply for the vacant position on City Council.

I offer the following responses to the questions set forth in the Special Notice to Rochester Hills residents. For ease of reading, I have restated each question.

1. Why do you want to serve as a City Council Member in the City of Rochester Hills? What would be your purpose in serving on the City Council? What do you want to achieve?
