CDBG – Funding Alternatives

The funds originally set aside for the paving of Borden Park can <u>only</u> be applied towards "construction type" activities listed below. The funds <u>cannot</u> be applied towards "service type" activities such as Rochester Area Youth Assistance, HAVEN or Low-Income Senior Citizen Home Chore Program.

Minor Home Repair: Minor home repairs for low-income residents of the city including:

- Furnace Repair / Replacement
- Mobile Home Roofing Repairs
- ADA Compliant Handicap ramp installation
- Water / Sewer Line Connection Charges
- Emergency Plumbing Issues

<u>Issue</u>: Since 2001, the City of Rochester Hills has used \$161,439 of CDBG funding to help low-income residents with a variety of household repairs including:

The City of Rochester Hills has used a variety of advertising methods to promote the use of CDBG funds for Minor Home Repair programs including:

- Mailers
- Flyers distributed in Mobile Home Park
- Advertisement in Hills Herald
- Mayor's Dept. staff receiving phone calls requesting help

<u>Parks / Recreation:</u> For the development or improvement of publicly owned recreational facilities including:

- Playground Equipment
- Picnic Facilities
- Restrooms
- Pathways
- Fencing / Signage

<u>Issue</u>: Use of CDBG funding to accomplish projects included within Parks and Recreation Master Plan, which were brought forward in the budget process, but not approved due to budget constraints.

Remove Architectural Barriers:

Retrofitting public facilities to Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards including:

- Installing curb cuts/ramps at intersections
- Automatic doors
- Barrier Free Restrooms
- Does Not Include Sidewalk repairs

<u>Issue</u>: Lack of demand or ability to use, due to HUD constraints, for projects. A number of eligible projects have already been accomplished by using CDBG funds.

Special Assessments:

To pay for Special Assessments levied against low income households for sewer, street, sidewalk, water or drainage improvements.

<u>Issue</u>: Lack of Local Road funding to bring forward SAD paving projects. \$32,000 has already been allocated to help offset the Special Assessment levy for eight (8) low-income residents that live in the Hillview, Midvale and Devondale districts.
