Communities of the Clinton-Oakland Sewage Disposal System

On March 27, 2006, you received a letter from John P. McCulloch, Oakland County Drain Commissioner regarding rate changes for the Clinton-Oakland Sewage Disposal System for FY 2006/2007. At that time, Detroit Water and Sewerage Department (DWSD) had not notified us of the Industrial Surcharge, Industrial Waste Control (IWC) and Look-Back Adjustment from FY 2004/2005.

In a letter dated June 23, 2006, we received notification from Detroit Water and Sewerage Department (DWSD) of the Industrial Surcharge and the Industrial Waste Control (IWC) charges for FY 2006/2007 along with information of the Look-Back Adjustment from FY 2004/2005 effective July 11, 2006.

The Look-Back Adjustment is a credit in the amount of \$582,838.00. We will credit each community their portion of the Look-Back Adjustment credit on the quarterly invoice. Attached please find the "FY 2006/2007 Distribution of FY 2004/2005 Look-Back Credit Adjustment" schedule.

The 2006/2007 Clinton-Oakland Sewage Disposal System rate of \$12.98 per MCF, the Industrial Surcharge and Industrial Waste Control Charges will be established in accordance with the revised Clinton-Oakland Sewage Disposal System Schedule of Rates and Charges, effective July 11, 2006.

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CLINTON-OAKLAND SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM

SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES EFFECTIVE JULY 11, 2006

Penalty

If any community, either totally or in part, demonstrates a peak flow that exceeds a 0.4 CFS per equivalent 1,000 connected population or an average yearly flow that exceeds 12,800 C.F. per unit, that community shall pay a sewage disposal service charge for the flow that exceeds the above stated limits at the rate of \$12.98 per 1,000 C.F. If any community allows their flow to exceed a peak of 0.4 CFS per 1,000 connected population or an annual average flow of 12,800 C.F. per unit for more than three (3) months without making necessary corrections, then the County shall cause the corrections to be made to the system and charge the community for all expenses. The said sewage disposal service charge, including penalty, if any, shall be payable quarterly. If any municipality does not pay its service charge on the date when the same becomes due, there shall be added to such a charge a penalty of one (1) percent for each month on the unpaid balance or fraction thereof for which the same remains unpaid.

2. Industrial Surcharge

The following Industrial Surcharges shall be levied against industrial and commercial customers contributing sewage to the system with concentrations of pollutants exceeding the levels described as follows:

A.	Biochemical Oxygen Demand (BOD) in excess of 275 milligrams per liter	0.271
B.	Total Suspended Solids (TSS) in excess of 350 milligrams per liter	0.309
C.	Phosphorus (P) in excess of 12 milligrams per liter	4.456
D.	Fats, oils, and grease (FOG) in excess of 100 milligrams per liter	0.164

It is assumed that normal domestic customers do not contribute sewage with concentrations of pollutants exceeding the above levels, therefore, the Industrial Surcharge shall not apply to domestic customers. Further, restaurants shall also be exempt from Industrial Surcharge per the Federal Court "Second Interim Order," dated July 10, 1981.

3. Industrial Waste Control Charge (IWC)

Each community shall report quarterly the total number and size of water meters used by non-residential users of the System. Where metered water is not available, then the community shall report quarterly the "Assigned Water Meter Size" of non-residential users of the System in accordance with the following schedule:

Based on the reported number of water meter sizes, actual and assigned, for non-residential users of the System, each community shall pay a quarterly Industrial Waste Control Charge (IWC) in accordance with the following schedule:

Non-residential users shall be defined as all users other than single family houses, apartment buildings, condominiums, town houses, mobile homes, schools, churches and municipal buildings.
