- <u>Blight ordinance used to resolve maintenance issues on vacant structures through court process</u>

3. New Ideas for Applying of our Current Ordinances

- Use court process to resolve maintenance issues on occupied building
 - Owners may have financial or disability issues
- Outdoor sales
 - New application for roadside stand permits
 - Produce and flower on sidewalk
 - Not allowed under building canopy
 - Special events permit for sidewalk and yard sales
 - Sale of all merchandise allowed
 - Not allowed under building canopy
 - Limited time frame

4. Future ordinance changes and programs being considered

- Partnership with the community
 - Homeowner Associations
 - Handbook being developed
 - Business owners
 - Site maintenance program
- Adopt the Property Maintenance Code
 - March 5, 2002 Property Maintenance Report (see report attached)
 - Dearborn, Dearborn Heights, Rochester, Royal Oak, Port Huron, Detroit
 - Reactive enforcement
 - Reasonable application
 - How do we deal with overgrown landscaping?
- Streamlining the court process
 - Designate a day for all communities to bring zoning and blight issues to the Magistrate
