Dear Ms. Stewart:

On July 6, 2005, the City Council discussed the issue of funding for the Community Media Network (CMN) Public Access Program. At that meeting the City Council passed a Motion containing the following positions:

- That the City of Rochester Hills fully supports Public Access Programming.
- That CMN use the monies available in the fund balance to finance the operation of the public access programming service as has been contracted by the ICCA Board.
- That, if necessary, CMN revise their proposed Scope of Service to work within the monies available in their fund balance.
- That once the fund balance is drawn down to a 15%-25% level of annual operating costs, the City will reconsider the question of funding and at what level.
